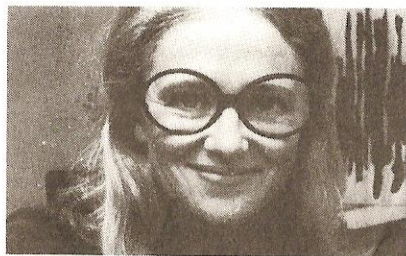
# BOOKS

'The Edward VII Issue of Canada' by George C. Marler, is being published as the first in a series of comprehensive handbooks concerning various aspects of Canadian philately by Canada's National Postal Museum. This volume, which will be ready in September will consist of 224 pages 8½ x 11 with 98 full color reproductions plus several additional black and white reproductions, all enlarged to assist with variety identification and color comparisons.

Two editions will be available, one in English and one in French. A limited deluxe edition, specially bound in morocco leather, has a protective slip case, is numbered, registered and autographed by the author - available @\$50.00 each post paid. The standard edition sells for \$30.00 post paid. Both editions are available from the National Postal Museum Confederation Heights, Ottawa, Ont. K1A 0B1.

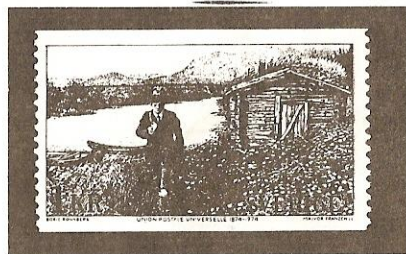
This publication looks as if it could make a significant contribution to the Society library. If purchased, however, a one page Review will be required to be written by the first reader to be published in the STAMPede!

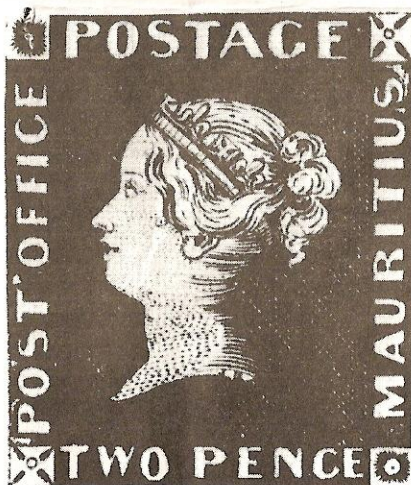


### Majvor Franzén-Matthews
