



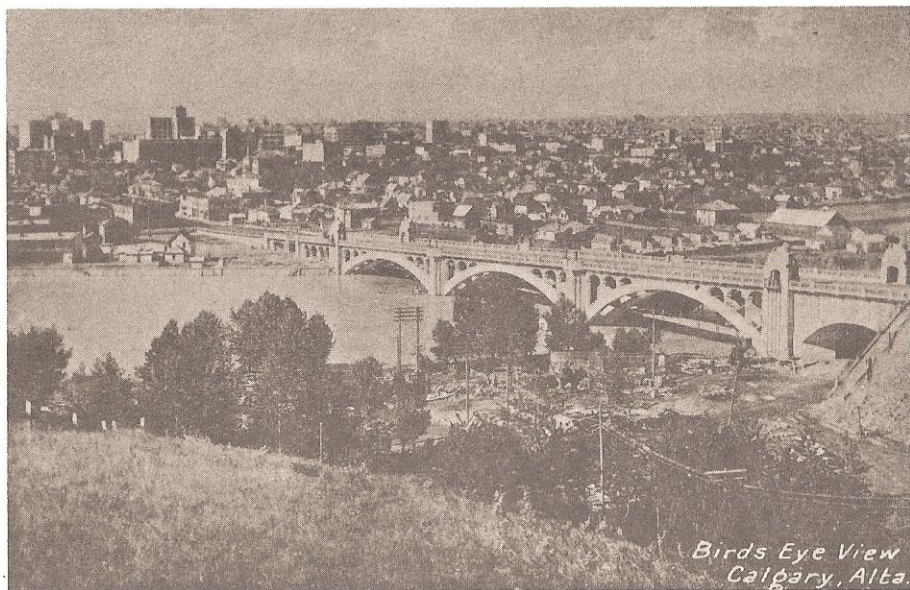

The Philatelic Library

The Calgary Public Library has a collection of philatelic literature which has been put together over the years without expert philatelic guidance. Despite this handicap, the collection is reasonably good and contains such standard volumes as Boggs' *Canada*, Jarrett's 1929 *Standard British North America Catalogue*, and *The King's Collection* by Sir John Wilson. The better volumes are either in the rare book room or in the non-circulation category.

The club has had some false starts in prior years in forming a library to make a wide selection of philatelic literature available to members. These efforts have never been successful and the club library is now non-existent. I visited the Calgary Public Library recently and to my surprise found them most willing and anxious to cooperate with the club in forming a useful collection of philatelic literature. Your executive has decided that a Department Head (Club Librarian) will be appointed to liaise with the Calgary Public Library and pass on your wishes for books to be included in the catalogue. Your President will handle this task for the balance of the year and recommendations for handbooks or catalogues to be included should be brought to his attention.

Finally, I want to draw your attention to the write-up on this fine society which can be found elsewhere in this Bulletin. For some months, we have been presenting details of other clubs and societies which are available to CPS members. This write-up brings our series to a conclusion. COLLECTING TANGIBLES

Over the past few years, collectors who acquired antiques or stamps or art objects have been reaping big profits relative to more traditional investments.

Compared to almost no gain on average in common stocks since 1964, art objects have more than tripled in price and gold has soared 500%.

This shows that once inflation becomes institutionalized, tangibles rise even more rapidly than consumer prices. The tangibles that appreciate in value fastest are those that are private and portable such as coins, art objects, and STAMPS.

Those who acquire tangibles may survive inflationary periods. Rising costs have meant continuing price increases for these items, and collectors' enthusiasm grows as they perceive the continuing rise in prices.

Usually collectors are those with a steady cash flow and a long association with and knowledge of such items as rare books, STAMPS, fine art or antiques. They are in a position to place their surplus funds into these items and then not take a short-run view of appreciation possibilities.

As STAMPS and coins have been rising in value at a rate of 20% a year, some bankers are increasingly willing to lend money with certain of these objects as collateral. Such loans can provide fuel for further purchases by the collectors.

Collectors in growing numbers recognize that the cost of borrowed money can, in certain circumstances, be recovered by purchasing items whose price will rise.

Collectors of tangibles must be wary, however, as they often get greedy. Price mark-ups can be quite high and unless people are knowledgeable, they may over pay for an item.

Further investments in art objects, coins or STAMPS must be considered as a long-term affair rather than an in-and-out trade.

Also, there are no organized exchanges, so an individual purchaser may have to pay a premium, and a seller may have to settle for less than fair value, particularly if the transaction must take place quickly.

Moreover, one must realize also that artificial demand can be created; witness the overselling of Olympic Coins.

Looking ahead, it is difficult to believe that government will grapple successfully with the problem of inflation. The industrialized nations seem unwilling or unable to find a workable solution. Many feel the long term outlook is for more inflation. Given this outlook, the trend to collecting tangibles seems more likely to persist.

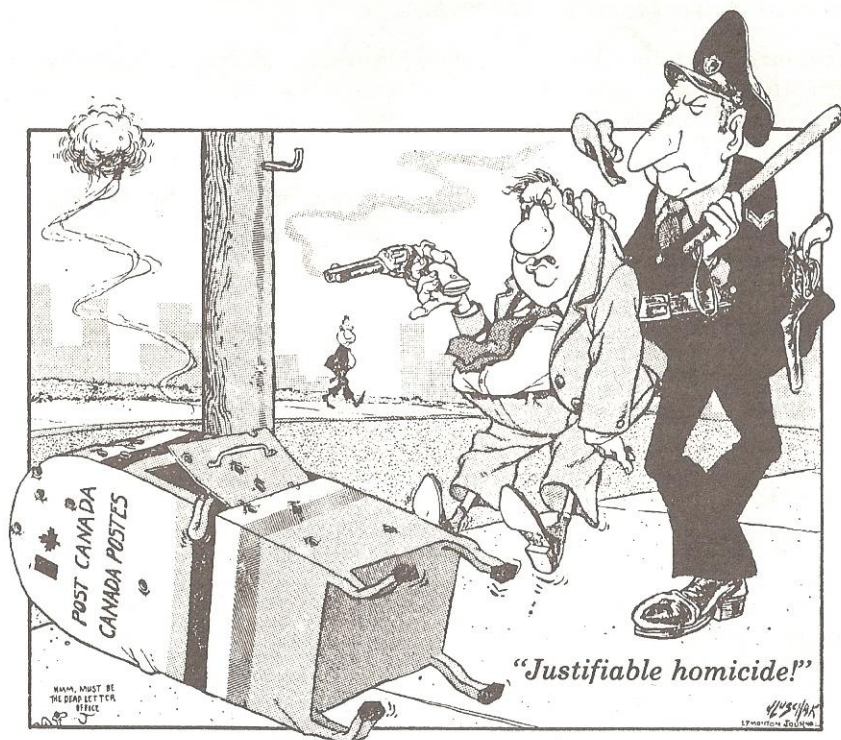

CALTAPEX '79 STAMP SHOW NEWS

The Calgary Philatelic Society annual Spring Exhibition and Bourse will be held May 5 and 6 at the Palliser Hotel. An auction will be held at the hotel on the evening of May 4.

The guest of honor at the show will be Alex Price of Vancouver. As well, Mr. Price will address the Saturday evening Banquet and he will be showing his excellent collection of 'CPR Philately' in the Court of Honor.

The auction will feature such lots as a complete mint set of Canada's Jubilees Scott No. 50-65 and a mint Canada Scott No. 7 with original gum. Many other Canadian, British Commonwealth and foreign stamps and covers will also be up for sale. Auction catalogues may be obtained from the Calgary Philatelic Society, Box 1057, Station M, Calgary, Alta. T2P 2K4.

Calgary's third Post Office will be featured on this year's show cover. As well, show covers from previous years featuring other Calgary Post Offices will be offered through the club.

A competitive exhibition of approximately 1500 pages will also be part of the show. Jack St. Laurent will act as chief judge. Collectors who wish to exhibit can write Charles Aubin, Exhibits Chairman, Box 1057, Station M, Calgary, Alta. T2P 2K4.

A bourse with dealers from across Canada and the United States will offer collectors an opportunity to buy and sell stamps. Bourse hours are from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM on Saturday May 5 and 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM on Sunday May 6.

Show and club information, auction catalogues, exhibition prospecti, and show covers are available by writing the Calgary Philatelic Society, Box 1057, Station M, Calgary, Alta. T2P 2K4.

SCIENCE FICTION?

If those science fiction writers who put their heroes into time machines to transport them to eras both forward and backward could offer their services to Calgary stamp collectors, maybe 1893 would be a good year to go back to.

In the Oct, 11, 1893 issue of Mekeel's Weekly Stamp News (which is still being published) the W. Elliot Woodward Co. of Boston, Mass., was offering used copies of the 1852 Canadian three-penny Beaver stamp for 15 cents each. Prices for the first United States issue (1847) were 40 cents for the 5¢ and \$1.90 for the 10¢.

NATIONAL POSTAL MUSEUM

We wish to thank former Calgary Post Office staff member Gordon Adams for sending us a copy of the Nov. - Dec., 1978 issue of Canada Post's *Alberta District Happenings* from which the following is quoted.

The national postage stamp collection is on display in an ingenious manner, allowing the visitors to pull individual panels out of a wall unit for easy viewing. Tempered non-acid glass and shielded lighting protect the original stamps against fading.

This treasure-trove (worth several-millions) contains stamps from countries of the Universal Postal Union since 1878, when Canada became a member. However, its main attraction is its unmatched collection of stamps of Canada and the British North American colonies. Among some 1300 issues, only 10 are still missing. Not surprisingly, it boasts many rarities, such as the 12 penny black of 1851; the only mint marginal pair believed to be in existence has a current market price of about \$150,000.

Also not surprisingly, the security measures surrounding the national collection incorporate the best that steel and electronics can furnish.

THE POSTAL HISTORY SOCIETY OF CANADA

Originally founded in 1972 as The Postal History Society of Ontario, its name was changed to the present one in June, 1977 to reflect the nature and scope of the Society. The Society promotes the study of the postal history of British North America only.

It is a non-profit society composed of students of postal history at all levels of expertise, and promotes the communication of members through the Society's Journal or direct.

Currently, the Society publishes its Journal quarterly (The PHSC Journal) and plans are in the offing to expand either the size or frequency of it. Contents of the Journal vary from fully researched feature articles to current newsy shorts. Articles cover the full spectrum of BNA postal history — from the pre-stamp era, the various cancellation specialties, meters, local and regional histories to the modern postal coding. Each issue carries a balance of material of interest to members. Articles are not usually interrupted by advertisements which are kept to a separate throw-away section where possible.

Members may avail themselves of the inexpensive advertising in the Journal, and for their local clubs, the Society makes available its *Certificate Of Merit* for competitive exhibitions (request data sheet on availability from the Secretary). The Society also presents its *Citation of Merit* at its discretion to such individuals that have shown extraordinary promotion of BNA postal history, furthering the field of postal history studies.

Membership is available to all collectors — presently only one class of membership is open — annual full member. The dues schedule is noted on the application form which is available from Peter J. Wiedmann, Secretary-Treasurer, Box 564, Cambridge, Ontario, N1R 5W1.

Although the Society's Journal is available only to members, *one* sample copy may be purchased for \$1 postpaid (mint U.S. and Canadian stamps accepted). This amount is credited towards membership on joining. Those who do not purchase a sample copy prior to joining will receive their extra free copy at time of joining — the issue being supplied would normally be the current one.
