CIRCUIT BOOK DEPARTMENTPLACING STAMPS ON SALE

The Circuit Books can be used by all members of the Calgary Philatelic Society as a means of disposing of their mint or used stamps. One sixteen-page book, which handles 192 stamps, can be purchased from the department for .40¢.

A minimum book value has been placed on the Circuit Books of \$20.00. This means that all books currently out can contain any value of material that the owners see fit. All books, however, purchased after October 15, 1980 will be stamped "Minimum Book Value Allowed \$20.00". The total value of a 16-page book must be at least \$20.00.

THE 15% FEE

When selling stamps through the Calgary Philatelic Society Circuit Book department, the book owners will be charged a 15% fee. This percentage covers the insurance for the stamps while they are in the hands of the Society, and also helps with the general operating cost of the Club.

There is a constant demand for better Canadian material in the \$1.00 to \$10.00 class, along with the general Canada and British Commonwealth. Most material sells for 25% to 60% of the current catalogue value.
