CANADIAN BOOKLET SE-TENANTS: PART 3. THE CENTENNIAL ISSUE

In Canada's centennial year, the Canadian Post Office released a new definitive issue, termed the Centennial Issue, and showing a revised portrait of Queen Elizabeth II and various Canadian scenes. The first booklets of this issue were released in February 1967. The booklet contained two panes, one of five 1¢ stamps and a printed label, and a second of five 4¢ stamps and a printed label. The stamps are perforated 12 by 12, and all have either one or two straight edges. Two se-tenant pairs, one vertical or one horizontal, are possible from each pane. 24,093,000 booklets were issued, making this booklet and associated se-tenants easily obtainable.

Following this first Centennial booklet, a second booklet containing one pane of five 5¢ stamps and a printed label was issued in March 1967. 14,002,000 booklets were issued, and, as in the previous panes, one vertical or one horizontal se-tenant pair was possible from each pane.

June 1968 marked a first when the Canadian Post Office issued a \$1 booklet containing twenty-five 4¢ stamps and two printed labels. This booklet marked the first time that a triple se-tenant was possible from a Canadian booklet. It was issued with all the stamps perforated 10 by 10, which clearly distinguishes them from the 4¢ stamps perforated 12 by 12 issued in sheets. 645,000 booklets were issued, which makes se-tenants from this booklet quite rare. In all, four se-tenants are possible from this booklet (see Table 1).

The year 1968 also marked a significant change in booklets and booklet se-tenants in Canada. In 1968, the Canadian Post Office awarded the booklet printing contract to the British American Bank Note Co. (BABN). The BABN began issuing what were termed integral booklets. These new booklets were printed with a one-piece folded cover with each pane attached to the cover by the tab on the top of each pane. The stapled and stitched booklet panes of the past were gone forever. The stamps in these booklets were perforated 10, as opposed to the sheet perforation of 12. The first integral booklet, issued in September 1968, contained 1¢ and 4¢ stamps printed side by side in a single pane of ten stamps. 1,464,000 booklets were issued, with each pane containing five se-tenant pairs.

Another first occurred in October 1968, when the Post Office issued a 25¢ booklet containing four 6¢ stamps, one 1¢ stamp, and a printed label. This booklet marked the first occurrence of a two-stamp vertical se-tenant. 21,604,800 booklets were issued, making this a relatively easy se-tenant to obtain.

Early in 1969, as a result of new postal rates, a large format booklet containing twenty-five 6¢ orange stamps and two orange printed labels (see Summary of Labels) was printed. Four different se-tenants are possible. This booklet was printed in rather small quantity, with only 2,660,000 issued. In January 1970, the 6¢ booklet was re-issued in black instead of orange. 4,070,000 were printed.

In mid-1971, the Post Office again increased postal rates, which resulted in the release of two more booklets containing se-tenants. The first was a 25¢ booklet of three 7¢ stamps, one 3¢ stamp, one 1¢ stamp, and a label. A number of different se-tenants are possible from this booklet. The same booklet panes were re-issued in a revised booklet released in Toronto in August 1971. The 7¢ domestic postal rate was only current for six months. For this reason, postally used se-tenants during late 1971 are very rare.

The second of 7¢ booklets was issued at the same time. It contained twelve 7¢ stamps, four 3¢ stamps, and four 1¢ stamps. It had a price of \$1. Only 468,000 were issued, making this booklet and its associated se-tenants quite rare.

On November 30, 1971, the Post Office issued two new se-tenant booklets in conjunction with new postal rates. The first booklet sold for 25¢ and had two 8¢ stamps, one 6¢ stamp, and three 1¢ stamps. This booklet contained both horizontal and vertical se-tenants. 7,200,000 booklets were issued. The second booklet sold for \$1, and had eleven 8¢ stamps, one 6¢ stamp, and six 1¢ stamps. The number issued is unknown, but current catalogue prices suggest that quite a few were issued.

The last Centennial se-tenant booklet was issued in August 1972 and sold for 50¢. It contained five 8¢ stamps, one 6¢ stamp, and four 1¢ stamps. It again offered a number of new se-tenant combinations (see Table 1). As with the previous booklet and many future booklets, the quantity issued is unknown.

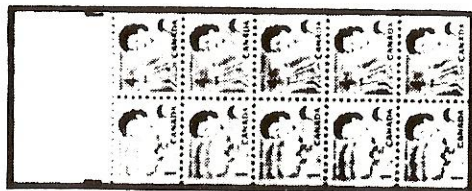
