THE MAKING OF THE POSTAL HISTORY OF CALGARY
by Dale Speirs

If, over the past few years, this bulletin seems unusually heavy on Calgary postal history and postmarks, there is good reason. A group of philatelists, led by the Calgary Regional Group of the British North America Philatelic Society, is in the process of compiling an anthology of articles on this city's postal history. The articles will eventually be published in book form as THE POSTAL HISTORY OF CALGARY. As one step in that process, articles are published in this bulletin not only to inform CPS members about the history of their city, but to solicit new information, and notice of errors or omissions. The anthology is being edited by Dale Speirs, with an assist from Al Gibbs for the DTP computer work. (Nevermind the superhighway, Dale lives on the Information Cul-De-Sac, and does not yet own a computer.)

You are asked to check the listings and help with whatever you might be able to offer as additional data. Don't wait until after the book is out to come forward, when it is too late. There is no fixed schedule for the book but we hope it will be out within about two years, depending on the supply of articles.

CALGARY SUB POST OFFICES

I regret that I did not become interested in the history of Calgary Sub Post Offices until about five years ago, when Canada Post commenced closing them and opening Type A Franchised Postal Outlets either at the same location or nearby, with full postal services. A few Sub Post Offices that did not close were changed to Retail Postal Outlets and then only two or three years ago changed again to Gross Margin Outlets. At present, to the best of my knowledge, only four GMOs remain:

GMO 98	- Thomas Cook, Calgary Airport Terminal
GMO 127	- Swift Print, 3716 - 61 Avenue SE
GMO 131	- Britannia Drug, 809 - 49 Avenue SW
GMO 153	- Shoppers Drug Mart, 901 - 64 Avenue NE

CPS FINANCIAL STATEMENT AS OF JUNE 30, 1994
by E.C. Kraft

To Whom It May Concern: The attached Balance Sheet and Statement of Receipts and Disbursements for the year ended June 30, 1994, have been prepared by me after a review of the books and records of the Society. In common with many non-profit organizations, the Calgary Philatelic Society derives its receipts from auctions, membership dues, and other sources, and as such is not susceptible to complete review of these operations. In my opinion, except for adjustments that may be necessary resulting from cash operations as noted above, these financial statements present fairly the financial position of the Society as at June 30, 1994, and the results of its operations for the year then ended in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

To The President, C.P.S.: From my review of your accounting records of the Society, it is my opinion the following items need to be addressed by the executive.

- 1) Insurance - No insurance coverage is in evidence to cover the exposure of personal liability, or tenant's legal liability in the Society's use of the Kerby Centre or the Chinese Cultural Centre. A loss at one of these facilities could be substantial, not only from the damage to person or property, but legal actions to defend such actions would be great. The Society's self-insurance policy is very limited.
- 2) While I do understand the voluntary aspect of all people involved in the operation of the Society, and the efforts put forth by those doing the work, I would like to see a general ledger maintained to record the accounting information on a yearly basis.

I would like to thank you for the opportunity to be of assistance to the Society.
