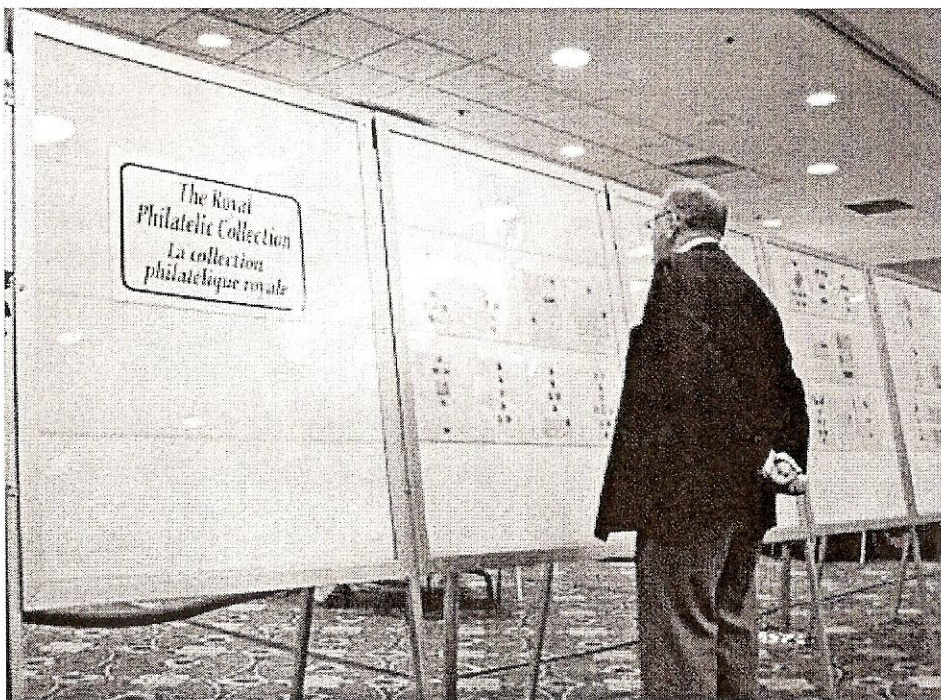

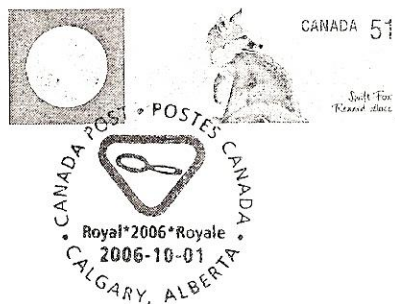

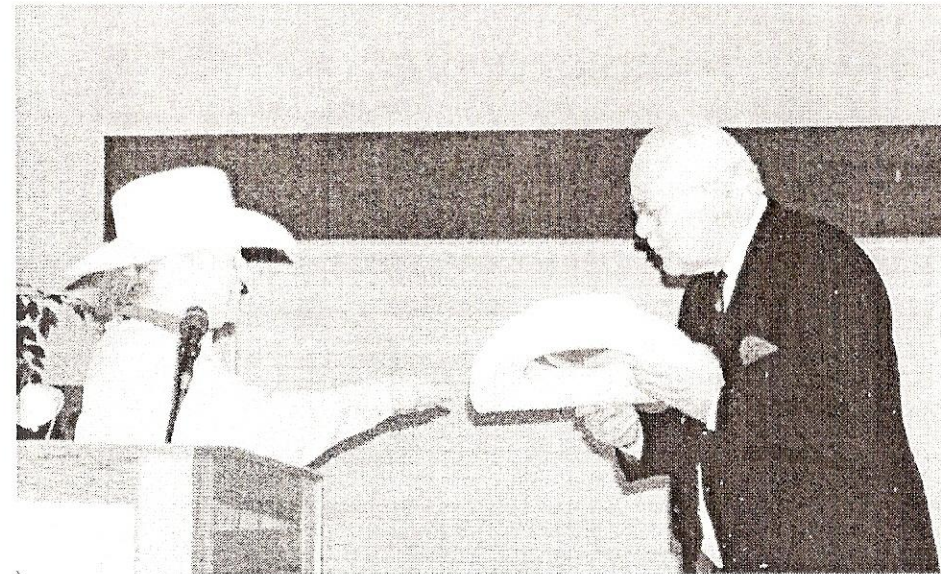

Whereas: Philately or stamp collecting is both a recreational and educational experience for many Calgary residents;

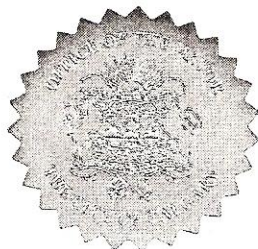
Whereas: Through stamp collecting, individuals can gain a better understanding and appreciation for the culture, traditions and history of nations around the world;

On behalf of City Council and the citizens of Calgary, I hereby proclaim September 29, 2006 as:

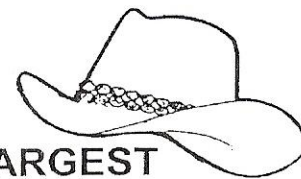

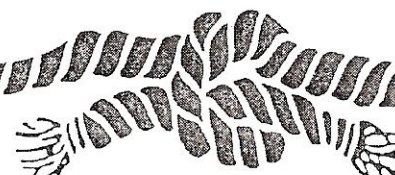
