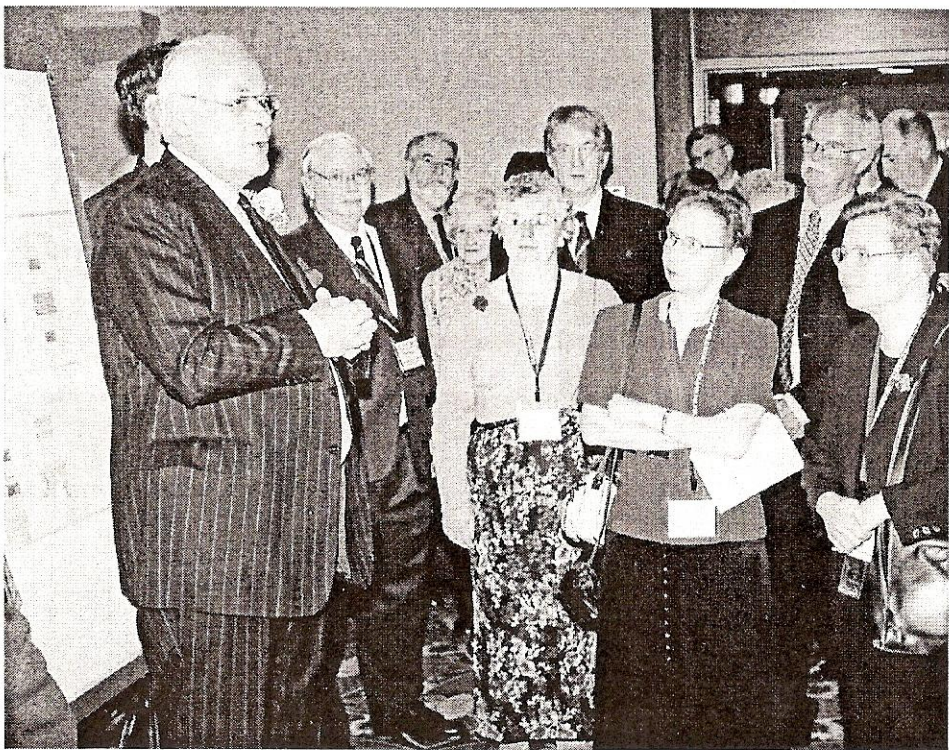

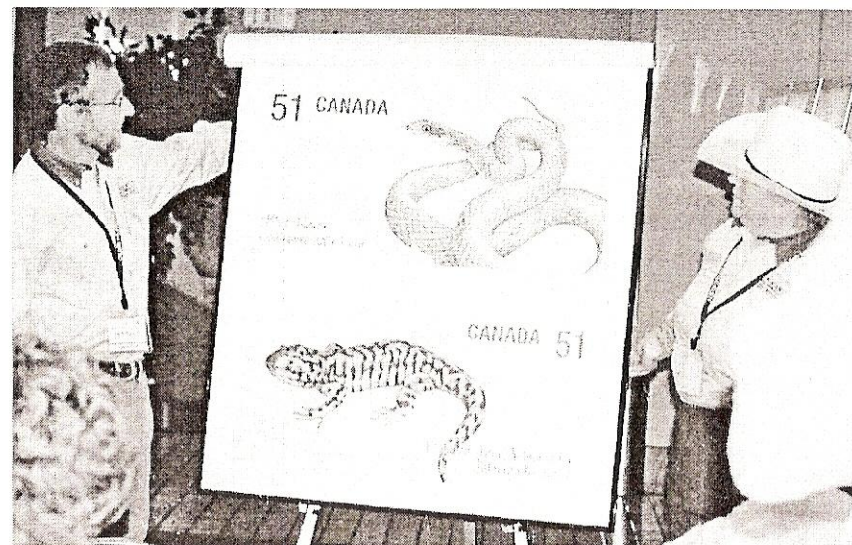
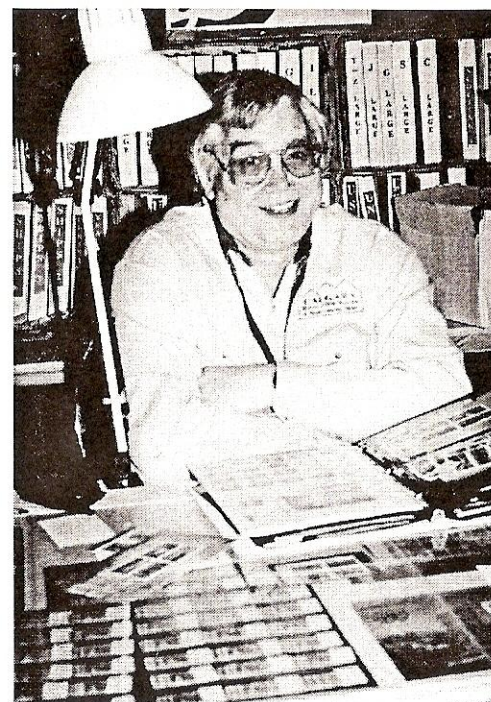


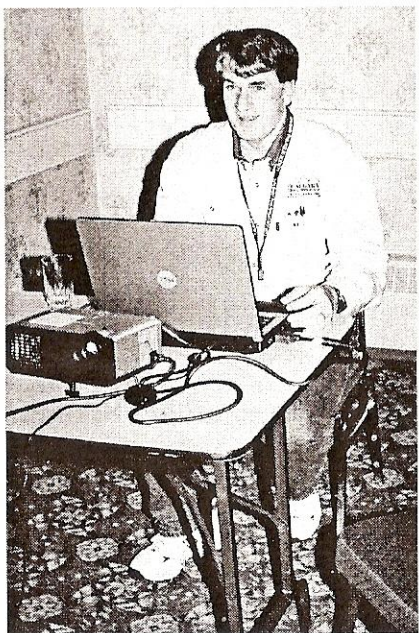

CALGARY IN THE SPOTLIGHT OUTSIDE CITY LIMITS

One thing that I took away from Royal 2006 Royale was the idea that organized philately in Calgary is now in the first rank of the hobby. We are no longer an isolated cluster of stamp collectors out in the boonies of the Canadian prairies. We are a major centre of philately on the North American continent.

The Activists.

CPS members may not be aware of how many prominent Calgary philatelists we have on the national and international philatelic scene. Jim Taylor, Steve Davis, and myself publish in major philatelic journals with international circulation. Hugh Delaney, Bradley Harris, Earle Covert, Bill Pawluk, and Jon Johnson have published or edited books or catalogues on our hobby.

In the national societies, Bill Pawluk is currently serving as President of the British North America Philatelic Society. Also on the BNAPS executive are Jon Johnson, Ed Harris, and Earle Covert. In the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada, the Circuit Books are managed by Sandra Foss. Ed Harris is a Fellow of the RPSC.

Steve Davis is the founder and moderator of the U.S. Specialized discussion group on-line at Yahoo Groups. We have a very strong contingent of exhibitors, such as Jim Taylor and Don Wilson, who have won international-level medals. Jan Brookes has been asked by American philatelists to go down and lecture on how to plan and run a stamp show.

National Shows in Calgary.

The CPS held its first public stamp show in 1927, but it was three decades before it hosted a national-level show. This year, we will host BNAPEX 2007, the trans-national (USA and Canada) convention of BNAPS, under the administration of the Calgary Regional Group of BNAPS. The first winner of the ‘P.P.’ was recognized at the Christmas Social; congratulations to Mike McPhail for his mouse-eaten cover that won the award as “The Most Abused Cover in the CPS”. The next couple of months the P.P. will be awarded for one-page exhibits. So don’t forget! Response to my inter-club one-page challenge has been positive in Calgary with both the CPS and BNAPS planning frames; the ESC are less sure of putting on an exhibit. Please bring your pages to the monthly meeting or CAPE so we can see how we are progressing.

At the Executive meeting in November we discussed a number of administrative items to improve the running of our club. Many of these will be implemented in the coming months. Only one impacts our Bylaws, consequently we propose to change Article 5a. to read: “The fiscal year will be from September 1 to August 31.” This will be discussed and voted on at the general meeting >30days after posting of this notice. Two new initiatives that I want to encourage all members to consider are: 1) a ‘Swap Meet’ either within our current meetings or as a separate event where members can swap and socialize, 2) a potluck barbeque in June to wrap up the year. Your thoughts and feedback are always welcome.

WHERE’S DWAYNE?

Our regular advertiser, Stampede City Stamps, operated by Dwayne Miner, is on the move again. Located for many years in the old post office building on 9 Avenue SW, Dwayne was forced to move a year ago when Canada Post sold the building to a developer who is now putting up a skyscraper on the site. He settled in the Penny Lane Mall nearby, but, alas, that building too is being demolished for a skyscraper. Calgary’s booming petroleum economy roars on like a freight train in full speed, and there being no suitable locations in the downtown core left at a reasonable price, Dwayne has moved out to the Scarboro district.

His shop will now be on the ground floor at 1613 - 14 Street SW, which is the Jimmie Condon Building. Look for a bright blue building on the northwest corner of 14 Street SW and 17 Avenue. Parking is at the rear, off 16 Avenue. Bus routes 2, 6, and 7 pass by the building. The move will take place by January 12.

CHRISTMAS SOCIAL AND AWARDS

As in past years, the December meeting was instead held in the dining room in the Kerby Centre. If you weren't there, you missed a good time! There was the meal, a short programme by Dale Speirs on postcards with secret messages, a quiz, lots of good conversation, and a good time had by all.

Besides the roast chicken meal and various events, several awards were presented. The Dr. Edward G. Mason Award, named after the founder of the CPS, is given to a member who has provided long service to the club, usually in some behind-the-scenes capacity. The 2006 trophy went to Linda Kot, who, since 1992, has been active with the CPS Library. She helps sort the incoming and outgoing loans, fill in the paperwork, and whatever else needs doing. Well done, Linda!

The Founders' Award is for service to the CPS during the previous season, something that made the recipient stand out by virtue of hard work and diligence. For the 2005/06 season, it was awarded to Don Wilson, who was Exhibits Chairman for Royal 2006 Royale, and who dealt extensively with the exhibit frames repairs and transport. This is the kind of heavy lifting that often goes unrecognized but is essential for the functioning of any show. Well deserved, Don!

The Show Committee has an award that goes to the best exhibit in our show by a CPS member. The award is renamed every five years to honour a CPS member for long service and contribution to the club. The most recent five-year period was 2002 to 2006, during which time it was known as the Bob Monilaws Award. For the five-year period beginning this year, it will be known as the Ed Harris Award, after the dean of Calgary philatelists. Ed was a CPS Director in 1964/65, 1979/81, 1983/85, 1994/96, and 1997/99. He was Show Chairman for the 1964, 1977, 1980, 1985, and 1988 shows, as well as doing behind-the-scenes work on them in other capacities. He looked after Programmes for 1986/87, 1992/93, and 1997/98, and was club President for 1978/79. He was named an Honourary Life Member in 1981, and Author of the Year in 1995. Congratulations to Ed!

Unlike many societies where a life membership can be purchased, the CPS does not sell them. Honourary Life Member status can only be earned by working on the executive or committees for many years and contributing in a meaningful way. Since Dr. Mason founded the club in 1922, it has been a rare honour. This year, Walter Herdzik became only the 35th Life Member in the 84 years of this society. He was Treasurer from 1998 to 2002, Vice-President in 1992/93 and 2002/04, and President in 1993/94 and 2004/06. Walter has also done much work on the Show Committee and behind the scenes, and he received the 1999/2000 Founders' Award. Good for you, Walter!

IN MEMORIAM: BOB MONILAWS

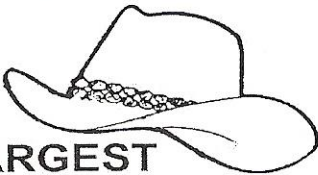
A long-time faithful servitor of the CPS was lost to us on November 19, 2006, when Bob Monilaws passed away from the lingering effects of an earlier heart attack. He was 86 years old. Bob served in the Royal Canadian Engineers during World War Two, and after demobilization joined the Calgary Police Service, retiring in 1977. Our condolences to his wife Mary and their family.

Bob joined the CPS in 1957, and held a wide variety of positions in the club, both official (as listed below), and behind the scenes on the Auction and Show committees. At auctions, he worked behind the table doing the paperwork as the lots were sold. He did a variety of jobs on the Show Committee, mostly as Security Director, drawing on his years of experience as a police constable. Formal positions held were Circuit Books Chairman from 1962 to 1967, Programmes from 1979 to 1980, and Director for 1975 to 1983, and 1991 to 1998.

As for honours, he was named an Honourary Life Member in 1978. He received the Author of the Year Award in 1994 for an article on D-Day philately that was later reprinted in CANADIAN PHILATELIST. The CALTAPEX show award for best exhibit by a CPS member, which is renamed every five years, was named the Bob Monilaws Award for the 2002-2006 period.

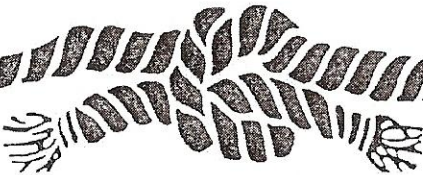
