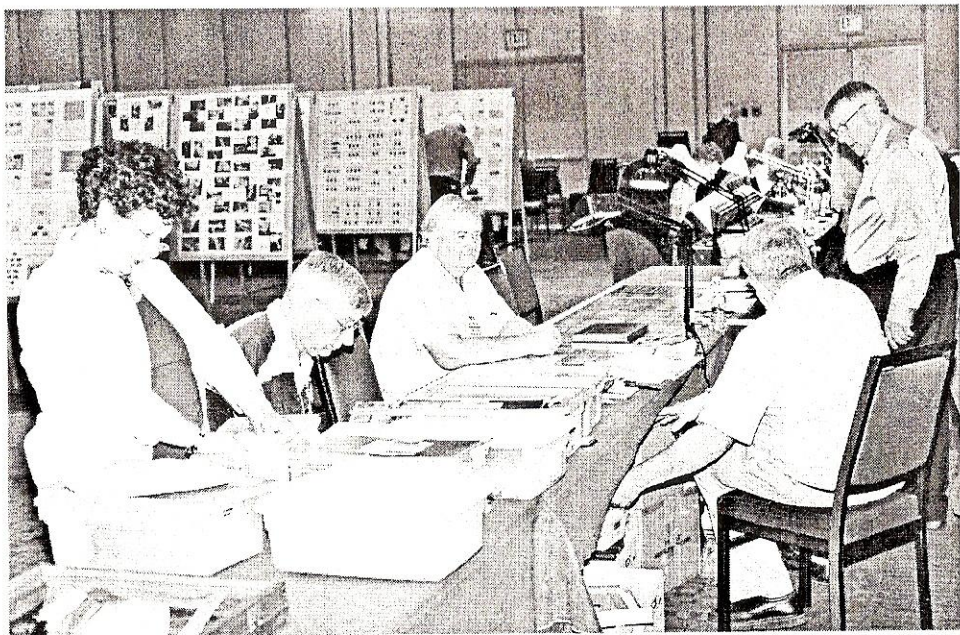

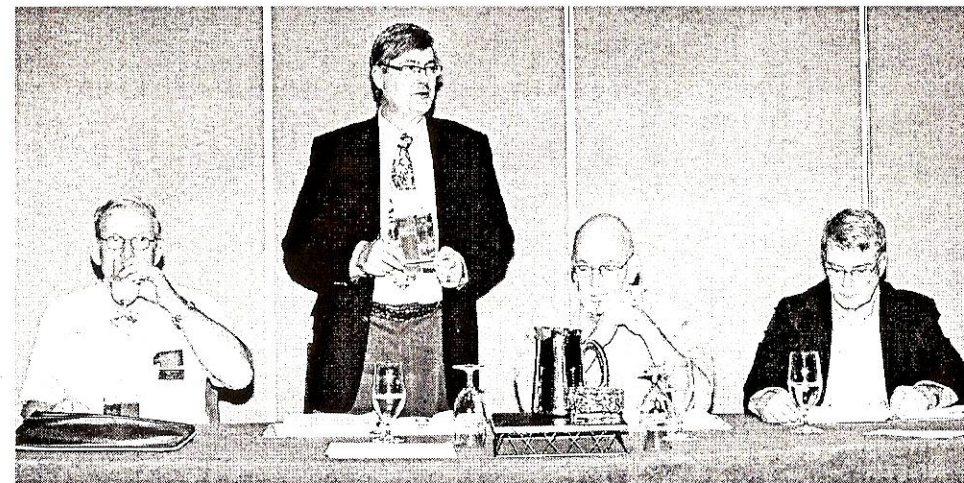

Calgary hosted its fourth BNAPEX convention this past Labour Day weekend, the previous three being in 1966, 1973, and 1985. (Some people also count BNAPEX 1960, held in Banff and co-sponsored by the Calgary and Edmonton groups.) This year's BNAPEX was combined with CALTAPEX and co-hosted by the CPS and the Calgary Regional Group of the British North America Philatelic Society. The show was well attended, the dealers did steady business throughout, and there were some spectacular exhibits never before seen in Calgary.

The Show Committee was led by Jon Johnson and Walter Herdzik as Co-Chairmen. Jon also looked after the dealer bourse and Walter took on the additional jobs of Treasurer, Frames, and Publicity. Penny Borrowman handled the Registration desk, Jim Taylor looked after Exhibits, and Dale Speirs edited the show catalogue. Hugh Delaney was Activities chairman responsible for the group tours to places like the Drumheller badlands and in-city tours and functions. Norma Nielson and Donna Trathen arranged the show awards and ribbons. John Delaney of Vancouver did the artwork used for the show catalogue, postmarks, Picture Postage stamps, show covers, and the banquet menu.

BNAPEX 2007 GROUP ACTIVITIES

The weekend started on Thursday, with a luxury bus tour, courtesy of Pacific Western Transportation, guided by Al Munro and Hugh Delaney. 27 members and spouses travelled to the Hoodoos in the Red Deer River valley, then on to the Swinging Bridge Park, where everyone enjoyed a special picnic. They then visited the Royal Tyrrell Museum of Palaeontology. From there, they travelled to a lookout that presented a panoramic view of a major part of the area where some of the dinosaur finds took place. It added an exciting element when the bus arrived at Bleriot Ferry, a small flatdeck scow ferry. Some folks thought the large bus would not be able to fit on, but it did with room to spare and three other cars.

Back in Calgary, at the Friday morning official opening ceremony, Denis Makowichuk, a recently retired postie, gave a talk on the life of a postman. The current President of BNAPS is a Calgarian, Bill Pawluk, who oversaw the proceedings and business meeting of the society during the weekend. He declared the show and bourse open.

On Friday, there was a tour of the city of Calgary, guided by Al Munro. This was followed by a bus tour to Heritage Park led by Julius Szekrenyes. Visitors saw restored buildings from various locales in southern Alberta. They rode on the sternwheeler The Moyie, and then a restored railroad train that travelled through the park. On Saturday, members and spouses toured various art galleries, guided by Andy Puzcko. Later in the day, many attended a private function of the show at the Calgary Zoo, where docents brought out animals for them. A barbeque followed to cap off the evening there.

Sunday was a downtown walk guided by Julius Szekreynes, a casual stroll in the heart of Calgary to see various present and historic locations. Former Calgarian Bev Wallace (now in Victoria, B.C.) took guests on a tour of the Glenbow Museum. On Monday, Gus Yaki provided help and guidance at the Inglewood Bird Sanctuary for the 17 visitors.

At the Awards Banquet on Sunday night, Jim Taylor introduced the winners of the awards, as well as the judges. On behalf of BNAPS, Bill Walton introduced the members of the society's highest award for service, the Order of the Beaver. Two new members were inducted into the OTB, namely Bob Lane and Peter Jacobi. Walton also announced two special awards for outstanding service to BNAPS, and saluted Grey Scrimgeour and Bill Topping. Banquet attendees received a limited edition cover with all three show Picture Postage stamps, postmarks, and cachets, the artwork for which was designed by John Delaney of Vancouver.



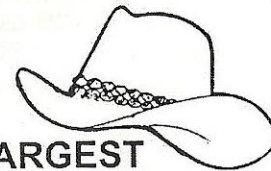

A survey was carried out by the GLOBE AND MAIL and CTV asking Canadians which federal institutions they trusted most. Canada Post was trusted by 90% of Canucks, the highest rating for any federal agency. The military was next at 86%, then the CBC at 84%. The RCMP and the Supreme Court of Canada were tied at 80%. CSIS was only trusted by 60% of Canadians, and you will not be surprised to learn that the House of Commons had a 58% approval rating.



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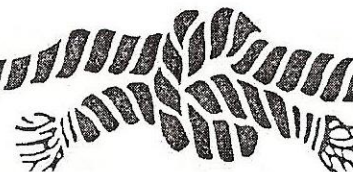
