PLATING BY TAGGING

The 2007 Queen Elizabeth II (booklet 363, Figure 1) offers a unique perspective to the discerning philatelist in that the booklet stamp pane can be plated based on the decorative tagging on each stamp.

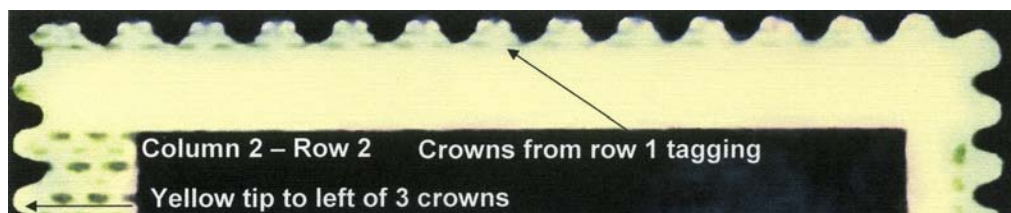


Consider Figure 2 on the previous page, a much enlarged montage photographed under ultra-violet light. The image shows the full stamp in column 1, row 2, with part of the stamps from column 1, row 1 and column 2, rows 1 and 2. The serpentine roulettings shown are simulated.

The tagging is decorated with closely spaced crowns on the left and bottom edges only of each of the 10 stamps in the booklet, but there are unique differences in the tagging imprints.

The width of the crown tagging on the left of the stamps in column 1 is approximately 3mm, and displays 4 crowns horizontally. The width of the crowns tagging on the left of the stamps in column 2 through 5 is approximately 2 mm and displays 3 crowns horizontally.

Stamps from columns 2 through 5 will show yellow tips on the serpentine rouletting to the left of the crowns, but stamps from column 1 will not. (Figure 3).

Similarly, on the bottom edges of the stamps in row 1 the crown tagging is only 2mm wide and two lines of crowns deep, while on row 2 the crown tagging is 3mm wide and 3 rows of crowns deep. Stamps from row 1 display yellow tips on the bottom of the serpentine rouletting. Stamps from row 2 do not.

All stamps from row 2 may display partial tagging crown on the top tip of the serpentes. Although, if the serpentine rouletting is shifted up sufficiently, the entire top tip of the serpentes could display crowns from the stamps above.

It is not possible to plate precisely the stamps in columns 2 through 5 on the Queen Elizabeth II booklet because all pictures are the same. But, at the very least, four different tagging varieties need to be collected for this stamp.

This method of plating, or reconstructing, booklet panes can be used on any of the booklets that display a decorative tagging border adjacent to the stamps and with an undecorated gutter between each stamp.

For example: the Lighthouses (booklet 364, Figure 4), which displays a surfer's paradise of rolling, breaking, waves in the tagging, displays similar tagging dimensions to the Queen Elizabeth II Booklet, with the additional feature that the stamps can be precisely plated. This introduces another element of stamp collecting for the discerning philatelists.

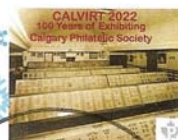

## **CALGARY BNAPS**

The Calgary Regional Group of the British North America Philatelic Society held its regular monthly meeting on February 9 via Zoom. Dave Bartlet moderated and there were 18 participants. The theme of the meeting was Canadian military camps.

David Piercey began by showing Alberta MPO (military post office) covers from short-lived camps such as the WW2 Mountain Warfare School in Jasper. Dave Freeman showed a WW2 cover from the Sarcee camp in southwest Calgary. Dale Speirs showed some covers of the CFB Suffield base, including the British military post office.

Doug Lingard then showed 1990s covers mailed from Canadian bases in Europe back to Canada. Ed Stephens showed postal cards which acknowledged gifts of cigarettes to oversea personnel. Dave Bartlet discussed give-away stationery offered by Salvation Army, YMCA, and the Canadian Legion during the wars.

Eldon Godfrey showed a WW2 cover from Canada to a POW in Germany. Jon Johnson had view postcards of WW1 hospital tent camps. Ray Villeneuve showed a WW2 Special Delivery letter that was rerouted multiple times because the soldier was constantly transferred from one camp to another.

## **CAPE**

The Calgary Association of Philatelic Exhibitors held their regular monthly meeting vis Zoom on February 23. Dave Russum moderated and there were 13 participants. The meeting began with a discussion about the advantages and disadvantages of virtual shows.

There was a review of forthcoming live stamp shows. Mini-exhibits were discussed (1 to 4 pages) and whether or not they would encourage new exhibitors. From there was an extended discussion on the state of exhibiting in general.

The next CAPE meeting will be on March 23 at 18h00 via Zoom. Norma Nielson is scheduled as the speaker, who will present a talk on her trip to the London 2022 international exhibition. ## **IN MEMORIAM: FITZ ROETT**

Fitz Roett died on February 5, a few days after his 76<sup>th</sup> birthday. He was survived by his wife Liz and other family members. Fitz joined the CPS in 1980. Over the years he was very active in exhibiting, and won the CALTAPEX Norm Tunna Award in 1981. He was a Director of the CPS from 2011 to 2013 and was active in the Calgary Association of Philatelic Exhibitors. Fitz collected Barbados and in 2013 published a book on the Britannia issues.

## **CPS GENERAL MEETING WENT LIVE**

Continuing the long journey back to normality, the regular monthly meeting of the CPS was held on March 2 at the Kerby Centre, with about 30 members attending. There was the regular business session. The President's Pot was then presented to Donna Trathen for her many years as Secretary of the club, and taking minutes of not only the general meetings but executive and show committee meetings.

Murray Bialek, in his capacity as Membership Chairman, reported that after two years of pandemic, the CPS was holding its own and still had about 130 members. Dave Russum then gave a presentation on postage rates and time of travel for mail between Britain and Canada, from 1790 through the pandemic.

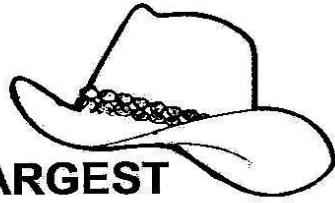
