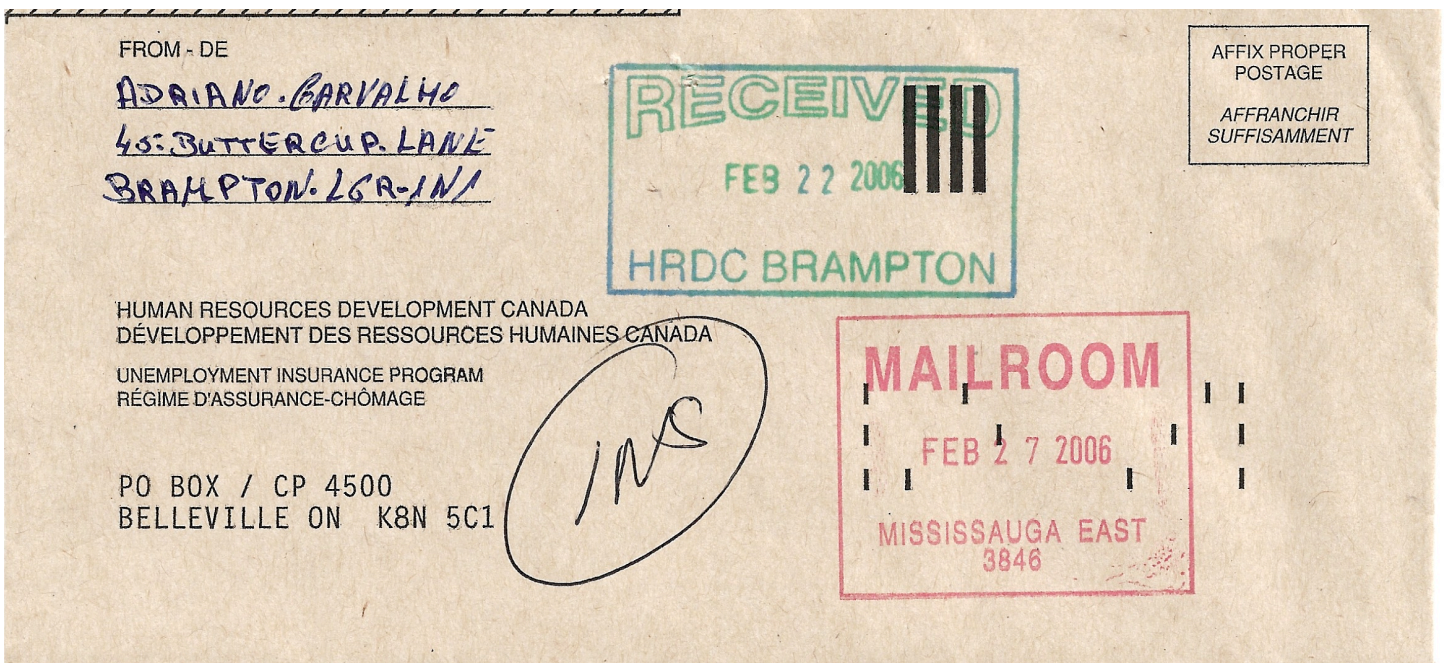


## Who Works in the Mailroom?

Besides the location cancels at the post office's disposal, such as circle date stamps and duplex cancels, there are a number of other handstamps used to identify different people and services behind the counter.

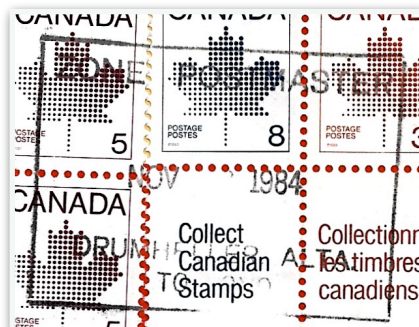
The following are examples of various handstamps that were used in the mailrooms from across the country. Copies have been adjusted in size and contrast for clarity.

ZONE POSTMASTER



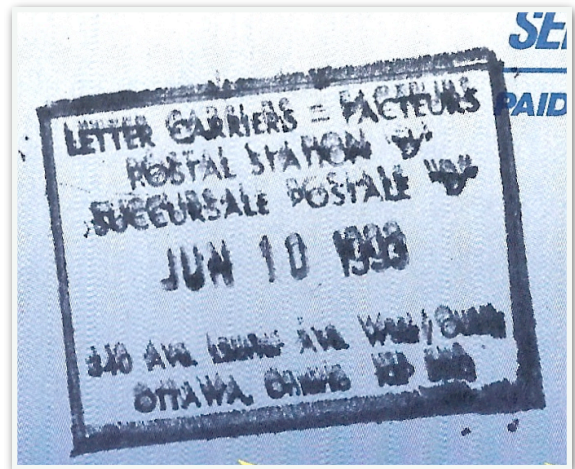
POSTMASTER/MAITRE DE POSTE

LETTER CARRIERS- FACTEURS

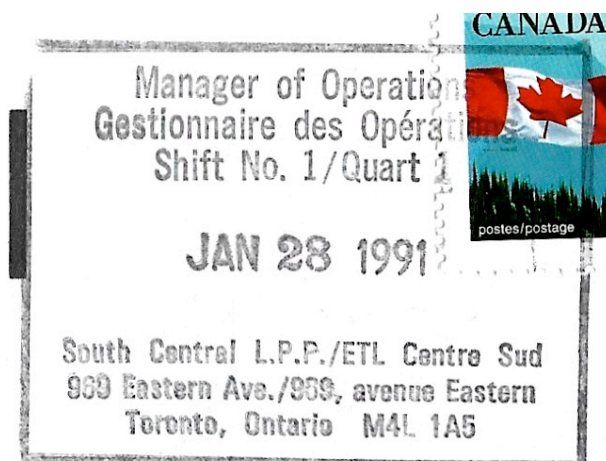
These employees require **Managers**.

Manager of Operations/Gestionnaire des Opérations

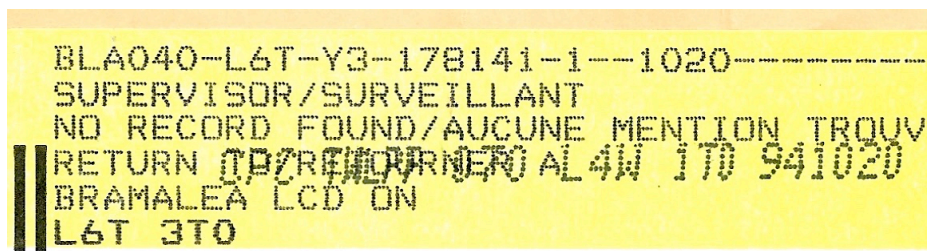
Managers report to more **Supervisors**, especially as services increase.

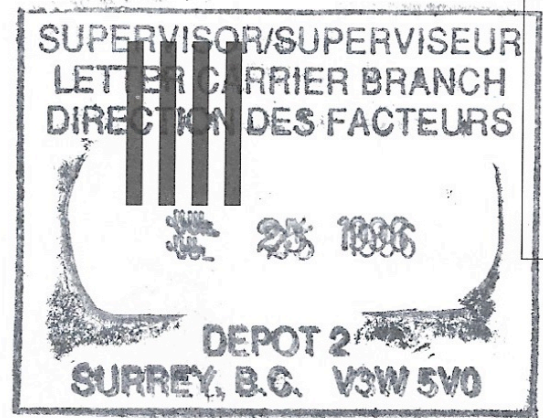

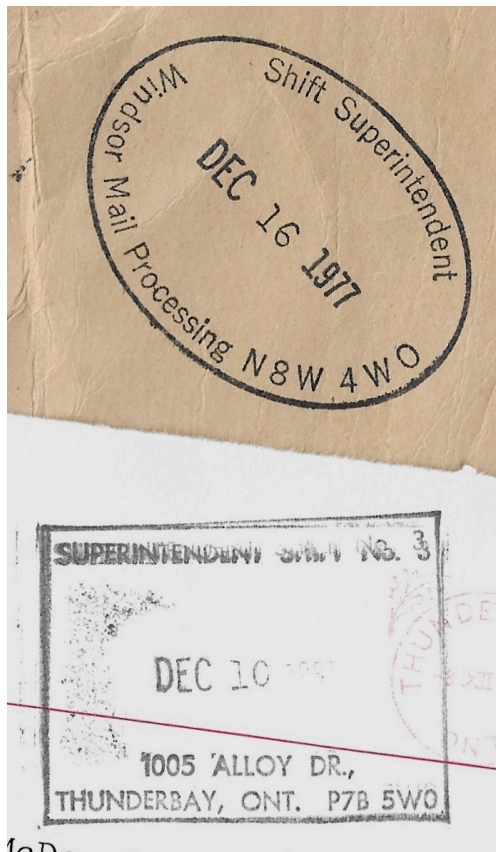

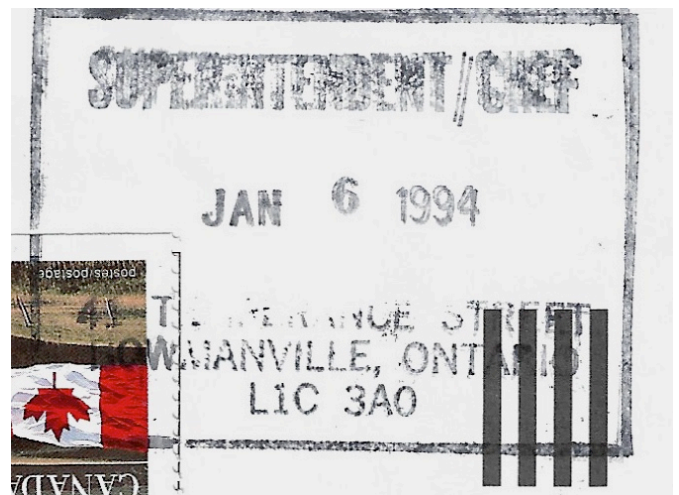

An enterprise like Canada Post requires its share of supervision so let's top the management chart with some **Superintendents**.

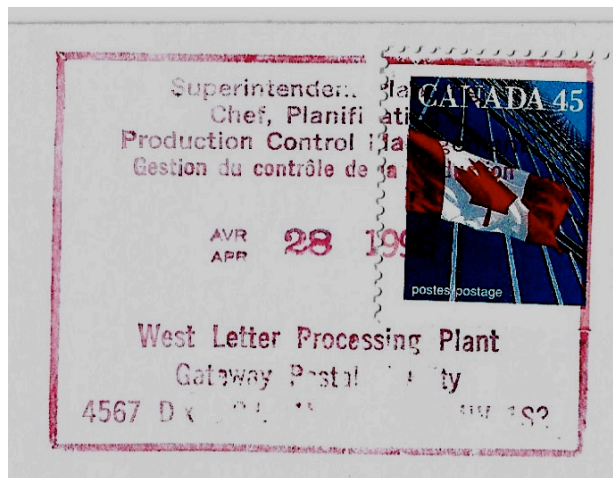
Shift Superintendent



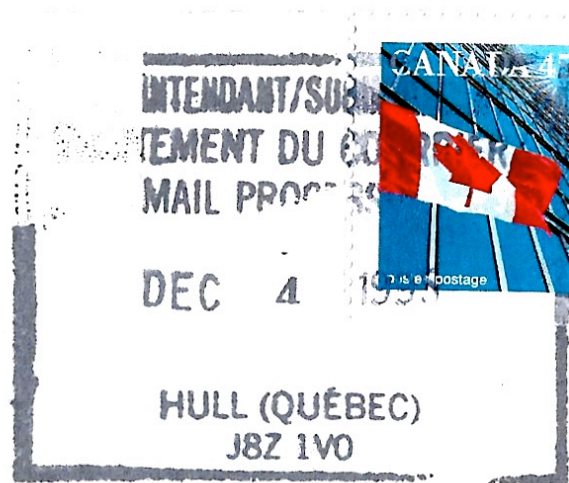
Superintendent Shift No.3



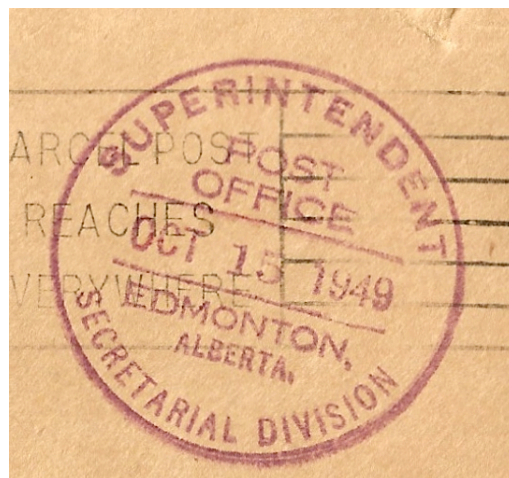
