# POSTAL HISTORY OF THE CALGARY WINTER OLYMPICS

This exhibit displays covers, postmarks, and meter marks relating to the 1988 Calgary Winter Olympics. The games were held February 13 to 28 at venues in Calgary, Canmore, and Kananaskis. The organization and deployment of thousands of staff in the era prior to e-mail meant that communication was by telephone or the mails.



#### PRECURSOR COVERS

Prior to the successful bid for the 1988 Winter Games, a failed attempt was made to get the Games for 1972, to be held in Banff National Park. A slogan cancel was used by Calgary and Banff post offices to publicize the effort in the late 1960s.



## **Outgoing Mail**


The various work units of the Calgary Olympic Committee (OCO) used a variety of envelopes and meters. In the early days prior to 1988, mail services were sometimes ad hoc, as shown by the cover below with a cheap rubber stamp return address. As the Games drew near, tighter control was asserted and the mail took on a more professional look with properly printed stationery.





The Olympic Arts Festival (OAF) used both a business-size envelope (shown on next page) and a peelable label (below). The label could be applied to plain envelopes, manila flats, or parcels. It must be remembered that this was in the days before personal computers and easily-printed sheets of mailing labels. Secretaries had to produce labels with typewriters, so the large size of the labels made it easier to roll them into a typewriter.

At the bottom of this page is an OAF envelope used almost entirely for philatelic covers, but occasionally for regular business use.








## **Postage Meter Imprints**

Like any large corporation, OCO used postage meters on outgoing mail. There were several meters, identifiable by their serial numbers.





## **Private Couriers**

For urgent deliveries, OCO used its own courier system, contracted out to private companies for actual point-to-point deliveries but otherwise entirely internal. The contractors did not process the mail through their own system, but only picked up closed bags, hence they did not have their own markings or labels on the mail.

#### **Event Postmarks**


Canada Post provided nineteen cancellations for the Games, available at the venues, Calgary philatelic bureaus, and the main bureau at Antigonish, Nova Scotia. The top cover is for the Opening Ceremonies and the bottom cover for hockey.





Top cover has cancels for (left to right) figure skating, cross-country skiing, and curling. Bottom cover shows cancels for downhill skiing and ski jumping.






Top cover shows the luge cancel. Bottom cover shows the biathlon and bobsleigh cancels.






Top cover shows postmarks for disabled skiing and freestyle skiing (at Calgary venue). Bottom cover shows postmarks for freestyle skiing (at Nakiska venue) and speed-skating.







Top cover shows two different postmarks for the Nordic combined skiing, which was split between the Canmore and Calgary venues. The bottom cover is for disabled freestyle skiing.





The top cover shows a postmark for short-track speed-skating. The bottom cover shows the Closing Ceremony postmark at right. The rectangle at left was a rubber stamp for the Olympic passport, which had 28 different stamps for the different venues. These were not legitimate postmarks but many people used them as cachets or as illegitimate cancels.








The athletes stayed at the Olympic Village at the University of Calgary. OCO manufactured the cancel shown on this postcard but it was never officially sanctioned by Canada Post. It was intended to be used as a receiving mark for incoming mail. However, demand from the athletes to use it as a souvenir to send to the folks back home on postcards was so great that Canada Post quickly relented and allowed it to cancel mail at the Olympic Village post office.





#### **Varieties And Errors**

The top cover shows the Opening Ceremony postmark without a date. The bottom cover, autographed by Juan Antonio Samaranch (IOC President) is correctly dated.









The proper method of dating the postmarks was year-month-day, as shown in the top cover. There was confusion among some postal employees, who set the dates at day-month-year, as seen on the lower postcard.




The postmarks for speed-skating and short-track speed-skating resemble each other very closely. Each postmark should only have been used on the date of the event depicted. The short-track cancel above (on righthand side) is dated February 14 but should not have been used until February 22.

## First-Day Covers: Official

Canada Post issued eleven postage stamps honouring the Calgary Olympics. First-day covers were issued beginning in February 1986 up until the day before the Games started, as shown on the next few pages. The first stamp, showing a stylized map of Calgary and area, appeared on 1986-02-13 as shown below.

















## First-Day Covers: Unofficial























Matti Nykanen became the first ski jumper to win gold in all three Olympic ski-jumping events. In honour of his performance at Calgary, the Finnish post office issued this stamp. The cachet on the cover depicts the ski jump at Canada Olympic Park in Calgary.






