16TH SCOTTISH INTERNATIONAL PATROL JAMBORETTE

The idea of a Jamborette on a Patrol basis was Jack Stewart's. Jack who was Scottish Headquarters International Commissioner felt that a smaller edition of a World Jamboree would be much more effective for making friendships. The Camp Chief is Dr Brian Fairgrieve. There will be some 600 Scouts in the Camp, half of them from Overseas. They will camp in 5 Sub-Camps, each Overseas Patrol being partnered with a Scottish Patrol who will provide tents and other equipment.



The first Jamborette was held in 1946 and every alternate year since. All have been sited in the grounds of Blair Castle, Blair Atholl, in the northern part of Perthshire, one of the lovliest of all Scottish Counties and set in the most magnificent highland scenery.

There will be an energetic programme of Scouting Activities—hill walking, expeditions, canoeing, community service and above all, a real opportunity of making friends. After the Camp, each Overseas Scout will spend a week as a guest in the home of a Scottish Scout, probably one whose friendship he has made in the camp.
