

Identifiable Mail To and From Canadian Naval Personnel During World War II; 1939 - 1945

One hundred and six thousand men and women served aboard one thousand, one hundred and forty ships and shore establishments during World War II. This represents millions of pieces of mail to and from naval personnel. Due to high security, very little of this mail is identifiable as to the ships it comes from. The purpose of this exhibit is to show that which has been found to be identifiable and how it was researched to be as such. Service mail from naval personnel serving aboard ships or overseas was granted free postage up to two ounces. The exception was for letters sent by air, special delivery and registered. In those cases full postage was paid. This is an ongoing study. All photos of ships are courtesy of "For Posterity's Sake".
